

National Mission on Enhanced Energy Efficiency (NMEEEE)

The **National Mission on Enhanced Energy Efficiency (NMEEEE)** is one of the eight core national missions under India's National Action Plan on Climate Change (NAPCC). Implemented by the **Ministry of Power (MoP)** and the **Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE)**, it aims to strengthen the market for energy efficiency and reduce energy intensity across sectors.

Core Pillars of NMEEEE

- **Perform, Achieve and Trade (PAT):** A market-based regulatory mechanism that sets specific energy consumption reduction targets for energy-intensive large industries, rewarding those who over-achieve with tradable Energy Saving Certificates (ESCs).
- **Market Transformation for Energy Efficiency (MTEE):** Accelerates the shift to energy-efficient appliances and equipment through innovative measures and pricing strategies (such as star-rating labels and LED programs).
- **Energy Efficiency Financing Platform (EEFP):** Creates financing mechanisms and risk-mitigation frameworks for demand-side management programs across all economic sectors.
- **Framework for Energy Efficient Economic Development (FEEED):** Develops fiscal instruments and funds—like partial risk guarantee funds—to encourage investments in energy efficiency projects.
